Murkong Selek College : At a glance

Murkong Selek College, the premier educational institution of Jonai Sub- Division was established in the year 1984, with the cherished goal of spreading broader knowledge among the aspiring students of this sub-division and beyond. Murkong Selek College is the outcome of the long felt need of the people and it ensures quality higher education in this land.

The Murkong Selek College is situated in the vicinity of Jonai town-ship area bordering Arunachal Pradesh. It is a rural area under Tribal Sub-Plan schemes. The Jonai Sub-Division is a tribal dominated area with about two lakhs population and of which 75% belong to the Mising community and the rest belong to the other tribal and non-tribal communities.

Murkong Selek College, the first ever institution of higher education in this background and problem infested place of Jonai was founded with invaluable dedication and sacrifice of the people of Jonai with modest aims and objectives.

The college is built in a campus area of 15 acres land and is housed in a beautiful building with spacious campus. The college was brought under 2(f) of UGC Act in 1999 and is affiliated to Dibrugarh University. It is the dedication of the college family that the strength of the college has reached more than 1100 students. The University and the council examinations results speak well of the degree of the academic excellence attained by the students. Stress is laid on character building and all round development of the students' personality. The college offers one year Diploma course in Computer Application (DCA). Recently the college authority has set up LAN (Local Area Network) facilities that enable internet access to both students and the teachers. The college library is well equipped and has a rich collection of over 12,000 books including journals, periodicals and magazines of national and international importance. The college also offers B.A. and M.A. courses in Distance Education mode under Dibrugarh University. The college provides canteen facility to the students. The college also provides both outdoor and indoor games to the students. Facilities like Indoor Stadium, Gymnasium, Digital Library cum Digital Classroom, Basketball Court, Day Care Centre, Cycle Stand etc. are also available in the college.

The college was accredited by (2nd Cycle) National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with C grade in the year 2015.

The college management has decided to introduce B.Sc programme from this current session.

Although the college has made every effort to provide the best services there is still scope for all round developments and progress. The college authority has been trying its best in this regard and as a result of its relentless effort an RCC Boys' Hostel and a permanent multi- gymnasium hall is likely to be completed this year. INFORMATION/RULES REGARDING ADMISSION

Admission will be made strictly on the basis of merit. However, in case of any dispute related to admission, the decision of the Admission Committee headed by the Principal will be final and binding.

A student intending to take admission must apply on the prescribed form. The form can be obtained from the college office along with the prospectus on payment of Rs. 100.00 (Rupees One Hundred) only. A candidate must not forget to collect the acknowledgement receipt while submitting their admission forms. Under no circumstance applications will be accepted after the last date or if the form is not completely filled up.

After the last date of submission of forms the admission committee of the college will scrutinize the forms / application and prepare a list in order of merit. The merit list will contain the names of the candidates along with the percentage of marks which will be displayed on the college notice board.

The selected candidates must take their admission on the specified day/days as mentioned in the prospectus by paying necessary fees.

If a selected candidate fails to take admission on the specified day, his/her seat will be awarded to the next candidate in order of merit.

A candidate will have to produce original copies of mark sheet and other documents for verification on the date of admission.

Exemption of fees partially or fully is considered for exceptionally meritorious students whom the college authority is convinced that he/she or the parents can't afford his/her studies.

NOTE FOR THE STUDENTS

- Students are required to go through the prospectus carefully
- Prospectus and forms can be collected from the college office on payment of Rs. 100/- only
- Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed form within the stipulated date.
- No application will be entertained after the stipulated date.
- Students will be admitted on the basis of merit.
- Student must have 85% attendance in the classroom during the academic session.
- Candidates shall have to produce their original certificate at the time of admission.
- Students intending to change his/her subject (BA/BSc. course/HS course) must obtain necessary permission from the Principal within one month of his/her admission in to the college.

- A Student seeking transfer shall apply to the Principal along with the clearance certificate from the following :
 - ❖ Library clearance certificate
 - ❖ Fees clearance certificate
 - ❖ Hostel clearance certificate.
- Candidate can be directly admitted to B.A./B.Sc. 2nd semester, provided such a candidate should produce Migration certificate that should be forwarded by the University authority and also the candidate should obtain pass certificate and Marks sheet of B.A./B.Sc. 1st semester final examination from the institution last attended.
- Students of ST, SC, OBC and MOBC are advised to apply for scholarship on prescribed forms obtainable from the college office along with their respective caste certificates.

SUPPORT SERVICES

LIBRARY

The Murkong Selek college library is one of the best equipped libraries not only of Jonai Sub-Division but also of the Dhemaji District. The library is equipped with INFLIBNET facility. The library is completely computerized with a present holding of approx. 12,000 text books on various subjects, 15 nos. of journals, and 10 nos. of other magazines and 5 nos. of daily news papers. The Library also provides e-journals. It also provides reference section which houses the journals, encyclopedias, dictionaries, past question papers of the university examinations and other books for reference purposes. The library has separate premises of its own. It contains minimum infrastructure facilities such as staff support, reading hall, book section, circulation counter, service areas etc. There is a Library Advisory Committee to maintain and promote library services.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The Students are to contact the Librarian for obtaining Library Card.
- At a time, only two books will be issued from a single card.
- Books are issued to Students only for fifteen days. Delay of the submission of the books to Library would invite a fine of one rupee each day thereafter.
- Students have to handle the books carefully. They have to pay the exact price of the book if they damage or lose the same.
- If anyone loses the Library Card he/she has to apply to the Librarian for duplicate card.
- Students have to deposit Caution Money to the Librarian. The Caution Money will be refunded on completion of his/her period or at the time of leaving the College after deducting the value of damage or loss caused by him/her to the College Library property. A Student shall be liable to compensate the cost, if the value of damaged or lost property exceeds the amount of their Caution Money.

HOSTEL FACILITIES:

Limited hostel seats at nominal rates are available for both boys and girls. Hostel rooms are well-ventilated and adequately lit. Each room is well furnished with furniture and has access to toilets, reading room. 24 hours running water and first aid facilities are also available in the hostels. In addition there is a reading room where magazines, newspapers are available. TV sets are also being provided for off time entertainment. The girls' hostel has an accommodation capacity of 48 students with well protected brick wall around it. The Boys' hostel has a capacity of 12 seats at present.

EVALUATION OF STUDENTS

The college monitors the academic performance by conducting unit test, monthly tests, sessional examinations, project works, assignments etc. which are the regular provision for assessing students' knowledge and skills. Internal Assessment (IA) as per university guidelines, are carried out by the college properly.

INTERNET FACILITIES

The college provides Internet facility for staff and Students on payment of minimum charge.

XEROX FACILITIES

The college also provides Xerox facility for staff and Students at minimum cost.

NSS

The college has introduced National Service Scheme (NSS) under Dibrugarh University. The NSS unit has 100 volunteers and one of the Teachers of the college designated as Programme Officer.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The Murkong Selek College Students' Union publishes a yearly magazine "MUSECOM" with the sole contribution from its students and teachers.

FIELD STUDY ON ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY AND TRAVEL & TOURISM MANAGEMENT

The department of History conducts field study for preparing projects by the students of 6th Semester students (Non-major) having travel & tourism management course.

SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS

Seminars, conference, workshops etc. are the essential programmes for faculty development. They are integral part of teaching-learning process. The college conducts National seminars, workshops & other personality development programmes. Resource persons from various fields are invited for such programmes.

STUDENT WELFARE SCHEMES

- **Drinking water** facility is provided within the College Campus.
- **DIGITAL CLASSROOM:** Digital classroom with modern technology is available for the students where they can acquire knowledge within a short span of time. It comprises of digital boards, overhead LCD projectors and internet connectivity.
- **Book Bank :** The book bank provides text and reference books to economically backward students.
- **Grievance Redressal Cell :** The college has a grievance redressal cell with the Principal as the Chairman and all the heads of the departments as members. A complaint box is provided to lodge complaints, which is opened every weekend. The cell attends to the grievances of the students.

- **Health Unit :** The college provides adequate health services to the students, members of the teaching and non-teaching staff. The college has a health unit with first aid facilities.
- **College Canteen :** The college has one well-maintained and well-decorated canteen run by contractors. The college canteen provides tea, snacks (light refreshments) etc. to the staff and students at a reasonable price.
- **Boys' & Girls' Common Room :** The college has separate common room for boys and girls for leisure and recreation. Newspapers, magazines and other recreational facilities are available in the common rooms.
